The Chairman, Cllr Stephen Davies welcomed everyone to the meeting, especially Ms Rachel Carter who joined the meeting remotely, Mrs Laura Shewring, Lead of Erwood Climate Change Action Group and the two residents from Erwood Village.

APOLOGIES were received from Cllr Tracey Jones, who had farming commitments and County Councillor Tom Colbert who was unable to attend. These apologies were accepted.

There were no declarations of interest.

Standing Orders were suspended from 7 p.m. to 8.25 p.m. for Agenda Item 3 on Climate Change.

#### Minute 22-2023

Erwood Cllr Stephen Davies set up the projector to enable Ms Rachel Carter to join

Climate remotely.

Change The following notes were taken by Cllr Caroline Baldwin as member of Erwood

Action Plan Climate Change Action Group:

Rachel Carter, Local Places for Nature Officer, gave an overview of the programme's approach — "To restore and enhance nature where people live, work, and access public services". She reviewed a number of case studies of completed projects, and outlined the targets for 2023, including increasing wildflower planting, reducing mowing and use of pesticides, increasing tree planting and promoting biodiversity.

Rachel outlined the various grants that are available and noted that she can come on a site visit to Erwood community, and make a report of recommendations.

Following the meeting, we agreed that this site visit will be at **10am**, **Thursday 30**<sup>th</sup> **March**.

Rachel Carter also noted that PCC are planning a Climate and Nature Emergency Conference in Llandrindod Wells on **Wednesday 14**<sup>th</sup> **June**, for town and community councils.

She was thanked by Cllr Stephen Davies on behalf of all present, The Clerk and members of the Community Council thanked Cllr Stephen Davies for enabling Rachel to carry out a trouble-free presentation.

Erwood's Climate Change Action Plan was then discussed with Laura Shewring and Cllr Caroline Baldwin as members of the Action Group.

### <u>Climate Action group goals – discussion</u>

Laura Shewring and Cllr Caroline Baldwin shared the progress made to date by the team, as it pertains to Section 6 of the Environment (Wales) Act 2016. This includes being one of 4 communities in Powys selected for a community carbon audit (now completed); active Commons management resulting in increased biodiversity in Common Land; and the creation of a draft Climate Emergency Action Plan.

#### Common Land

- Cllr Stephen Davies to get a list of who is on the Commoners
  Association and to investigate what their rights are, and what are the rights of
  the Lord of the Manor, as it relates to Common Land, with the objective of
  understanding what is possible to be done to increase further biodiversity.
- We discussed suggestions included Flower Planters to be installed to stop people from driving across the Common, and printing posters to display in the Commons to highlight the actions being taken to increase biodiversity.

#### **Draft Climate Emergency Action Plan**

- Laura noted that our plan is very focused on reducing Carbon outputs, so will need to create one that is more focused on increasing biodiversity, using the OVW template.
- This 35 point plan acts as a living, breathing document; actions can be added / amended / removed as it progresses, noting that things are more likely to take place if they are documented.
- We discussed sharing this document at forums of other existing groups in the community to get their inputs, in particular on contentious issues, so decision-making is felt to be owned by the whole community.
- The community councillors gave their support to this approach. Laura Shewring & Caroline Baldwin were thanked for their involvement in these discussions. The agenda items then followed.

MINUTES of the last meeting of Erwood Community Council on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> January 2023 were discussed and it was agreed that the Chairman sign them as a true record.

Cllr Stephen Davies agreed to find out who owns the small field next to the houses on the right hand side of the A470 opposite The Holmes. It was also suggested that Rachel Carter be asked to look at the problem when she meets up with Erwood Climate Action Group at end of March and the Rights of Way Officer, PCC may be able to help as well.

Pot Holes

etc. on Crickadarn Roads

(c) It has been reported that deep pot holes on the road out of Crickadarn up to Springfield need filling. The road to Ty Hir is in a very bad state of repair and the surface has broken up in many places. Cllr Stephen Davies stated that pot holes on the road up to Penyworlod Farm are 4-6 inches deep and this road is used regularly by over 8 vehicles every day. All these to be reported to Highways Depot, Boughrood.
